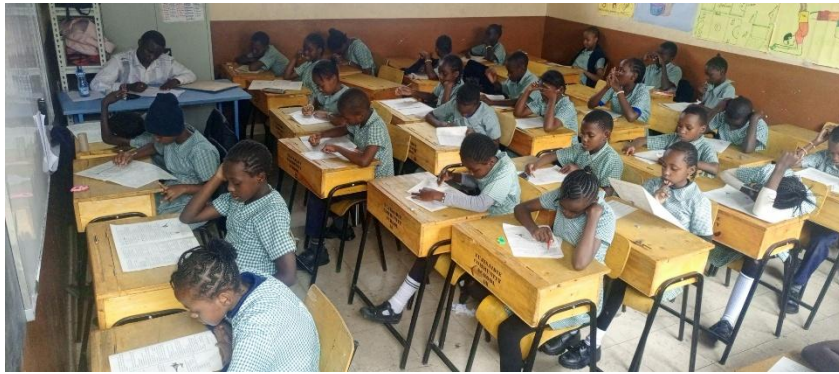


News and Prayer Requests from Tujisaidie March 2026

6 new classrooms enable growth in school roll.



With financial support from Irish Mission Agency (facilitated by CMSI) the Tujisaidie Community School is now operating with 6 new and upgraded classrooms, producing “a pride and joy on the faces of the learners as the spaces are now more conducive to learning”, according to the end of project Evaluation. The increased space has also enabled the student roll to expand from 320 to 378 students, with a projection of 400 at the start of the current academic year.

there is currently no government provision for grade 7 – 8 students in the area.



At the Tumaini African

Foundation the IT hub (left) is delivering its vision of equipping the community young people with IT skills for employment and to help the community in problem solving from a tech point of view.

The hub also supports the Tujisaidie school by offering computer lessons, enables TAF teens to acquire computer skills. It has 14 laptop computers + 1 TV monitor for digital learning and is able to accommodate 20 students per lesson.
