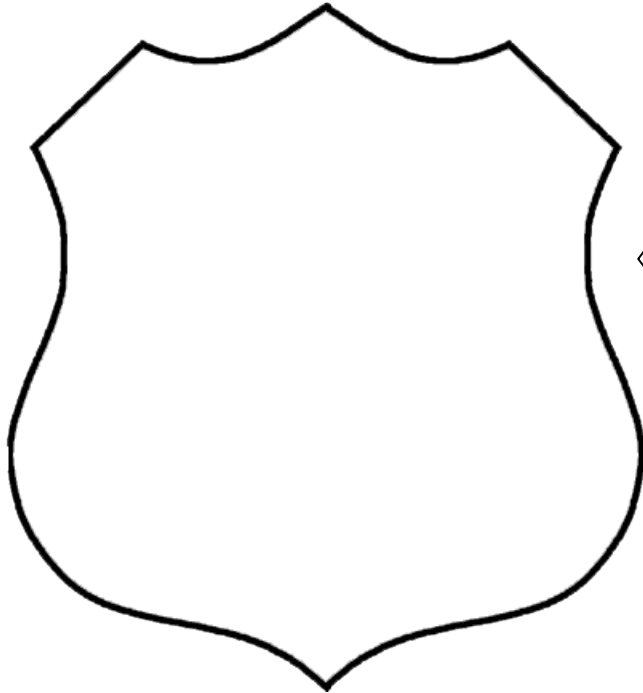

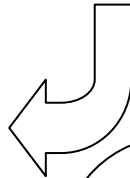


GFS Motto

GFS in the World

The GFS World Council meets every three years and has been hosted in Ireland on three separate occasions. However, it is felt that three years is a quite a long time between World Councils and that it is very hard to keep up to date with what is happening in all the other GFS countries around the world. So an idea of 'Linked Countries' was created.

A group of linked countries is made up of 'older' GFS member countries and other 'newer' GFS member countries. Ireland is one of the older members in its linked group.

These countries exchange correspondence within the link and thus receive support and encouragement from the other members of their linked group. The groups all contain GFS country members that have different social and economic backgrounds. Each GFS country may face its own unique problems, but there are numerous problems that all GFS member countries face and so they can help each other within the link.

Part of the work done at World Council is to decide upon a "World Project". A list of potential projects is discussed followed by a vote to select a project for the next three years. Each GFS country then encourages its members to support the project prayerfully and financially.

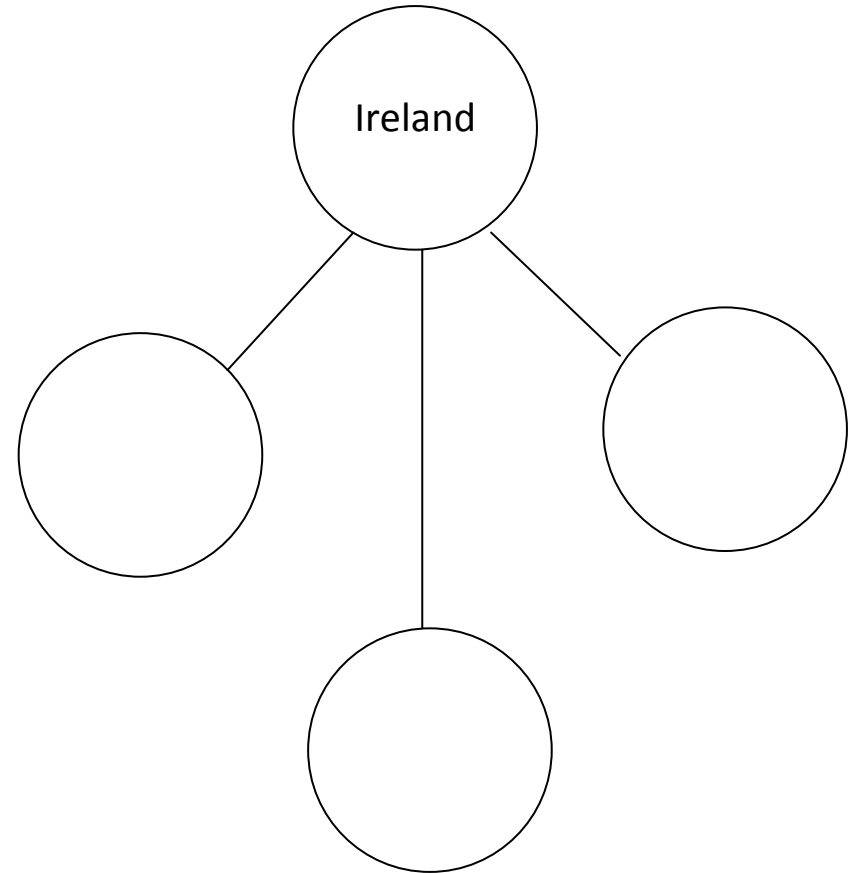
