

# **GFS World Project**: English for Employment Prospects (EEP)

PROGRESS REPORT: JUNE - DECEMBER 2019

## General

#### Visit of Ms Val Gribble

The GFS Immediate Past World President Lay Canon Ms Val Gribble visited Sri Lanka from July 25 - August 1, 2019, to observe the implementation of the World Project in Sri Lanka.

- \* On July 27 she participated in the first Award Ceremony of the World Project held at GFS Headquarters, at which the chief guest was the Bishop of the Diocese of Colombo.
- \* On July 28 she visited the Southern Province -
- 1. All saints' Church, Galle She met the Archdeacon of Galle, participated in a programme, met members of the newly established GFS group and presented them with their GFS badges. She also met some of the prospective participants of the EEP Course.
- 2. St. Anne's Church, Kitulampitiya She participated at a meeting and heard about the computer class that the Priest in charge of this church was trying to conduct for children of less privileged communities.

- 1. GFS Regional Office, Dickoya She participated in a programme, met members of the newly established GFS group and presented them with their GFS badges. She also met the girls of the Hatton batch who had just begun the EEP Course.
- \* On July 31 she paid a courtesy call on Rt Rev Keerthisri Fernando, Bishop of the Diocese of Kurunegala, to inform and promote the World Project.

### **Award Ceremony**

A grand award ceremony was held on July 27, 2019 at GFS Headquarters in Colombo, at which 24 girls who successfully completed the English Course were awarded their certificates. The chief guest was the Bishop of the Colombo Diocese of the Anglican Church, Rt. Rev. Dhiloraj Canagasabey, while the guest of honour was Lay Canon Val Gribble, Immediate Past GFS World President. Ms Sherryn Yaseen, the Founder/CEO and Mr Victor Patrick, General Manager of the American College of Higher Education too participated.

The chief guest was led from the road entrance to the Hall by traditional dancers and drummers amidst a guard of honour accorded by the *Pink Pearls* and the *Star Sapphires* who then marched into the Hall with the GFS banner. The guests were led into the Hall by the dancers and drummers and the Bishop was garlanded and Ms Gribble and Ms Yaseen were presented with bouquets of flowers. The traditional oil lamp was lit. Two cultural dance items were presented and appreciated by all.

The winner of the GFS Speech Contest gave a moving speech about the opportunity she received to follow the English Course and expressed her gratitude to God and the GFS. A power point presentation of the World Project in action was an eye opener to many to understand the objectives and value of this project undertaken by Sri Lanka.

The carpeted stage of the GFS Hall with the GFS logo as the backdrop was a fitting setting as the Bishop presented the prestigious Certificates of the American College of Higher Education to the successful students. Thereafter, Ms Gribble and Ms Yaseen congratulated the students.

## **Impact of the Project**

The project which aims to better equip young girls for the competitive job market through a job-related English course, has positively impacted the lives of the girls of these two batches. Some obtained employment, several moved upward in their careers and others are pursuing higher education in Nursing and HR. Two Anglican ministerial candidates are following a theology degree.

### **Christmas Party**

The two batches gathered for a Christmas Party at the GFS Hall in Colombo on December 11, 2019, along with the GFS *Pink Pearls*. All the girls enjoyed the programme planned for them which included worship, motivational speaker, games, lucky dip, refreshments and plenty of fun and opportunities for them to display their talents.

3<sup>rd</sup> Batch - <u>Hatton</u> ("Esther") (*Central Province*)

#### **The Course**

The third batch of the World Project commenced on July 20, 2019 and was completed on October 26, 2019. A total of 19 girls completed the Course. Extra coaching classes were organized to help the weaker girls along the way. This batch awaits the awarding of their certificates.

#### **Impact**

Ten girls currently hold jobs at the Estate Community Development Mission (ECDM), which operates under the Board of Social Responsibility of the Anglican Church and strives to uplift the lives of the estate communities. One girl works for a hotel. The English classes have helped them perform better in their jobs. Some girls are looking for job opportunities, while one is awaiting admission to the Law Faculty of a State University.

#### **GFS Regional Office**

The regional office was blessed and opened by the Archdeacon of Nuwara Eliya in Dickoya in the Hatton area on July 6, 2019 to conduct EEP classes and serve GFS groups in the region by supporting them and organizing regional programmes.

### **The Course**

The fourth batch commenced on September 21, 2019 and was completed on January 18, 2020. A total of 18 girls from the Galle district completed the Course.

This batch awaits the awarding of their certificates.

#### **Impact**

The English classes have helped some girls secure salaried employment in small business enterprises in Galle. Others are able to perform better in their existing jobs.

A Regional Co-ordinator was recruited to oversee the EEP Course and ensure the smooth operation of activities in Galle.

## 1. Galle GFS Group

Membership

This is the initial group formed in the Galle District, Southern Province. This group comprises of women belonging to eight churches in the region.

**Programmes** 

- \* Night Vigil conducted at All Saints' Church, Galle.
- \* Computer Class

A computer class is being conducted for children who live in the vicinity of St. Anne's Church, Kithulampitiya. Our thanks to GFS Australia for their generosity in gifting a computer to be used to assist this low income community.

#### **Future plans**

Networking with the Anglican priests and church women's groups to form new GFS groups and conducting activities is done by the part-time Regional Co-ordinator of GFS at Galle.

## 1. Deniyaya GFS Group

## GFS and promoting the EEP Course


Several introductory programmes have been planned in the above areas.
